Dear Palmdale Redistricting Commissioners,

The Alianza Latina del Valle del Antilope, a Coalition of Latino organizations and community leaders including the Antelope Valley League of United Latin American Citizens-AV-LULAC, SALVA, Coalition for Humane Immigration Rights-Antelope Valley Chapter-CHIRLA-AV, The Dolores Huerta Foundation- Antelope Valley Chapter-DHF-AV, Café con Leche, Inc., Pueblo y Salud, Inc.-PyS, the American Civil Liberties Union-Antelope Valley Chapter-ACLU-AV, the Tavera Foundation, Latinx Council for the Prevention of Child Abuse-LCPCA, Helping Hands AV, Latino business and union representatives write to state their support for *Palmdale Redistricting 2021 Public Maps 205 and 203*.¹

They comply with Federal Law ensuring minimal population deviation limiting it to 2.90% in Map 205 and 3.81% in Map 203.

We also believe these plans comply with the Federal Voting Rights Act (VRA). Both of these maps create three Latino majority citizen voting age population (CVAP) districts, which may be required by the Federal Voting Rights Act (VRA). This is justified by the increase in Latino population during the past decade which currently comprises 62% of the City's total population. Please also note recent findings by Court of racially polarized voting (RPV) in Palmdale, which recently resulted in violations of voting rights of protected classes; in this case, Black voters and Latinos.²

Maps 205 and 203 take into consideration geographic contiguity while keeping communities of interest intact. They preserve the core of existing districts and anticipate future growth. When the City was last divided into districts, today's District 1 did not have Latinos as the majority of citizen voting age population. Today, that District has 53% Latino CVAP and it is anticipated that growth will continue in and around that district. Please note that Maps 205 and 203 have inverted district 1 and 2.


We thank you for the time and effort you have volunteered in order to ensure a fair and open redistricting process to date in the city of Palmdale.


